Student Absences

Parents can email <u>brookwoodabsence@psd70.ab.ca</u> at any time to notify us of the absence, or call the school at 780-962-3942 and talk to Nicole or Shannon or leave a message on the answering machine.

When a student is marked Absent-Unknown parents will receive an automated phone call and email from our computer-generated voice asking you to notify the school of the whereabouts of your child. Students marked Absent-Known will not receive a call or email. The recording will prompt you to call or email the school to confirm the absence. Currently, calls will go out at 9:15 and 1:10 for morning and afternoon attendance respectively.

Medical Concerns /Severe Allergies

Please notify the school as soon as possible if your child has a medical condition or severe allergy that may require medical attention. Should your child require medication to be administered, a Request for Assistance to Administer Medication form will need to be filled out in the office in advance. This form requires that it be endorsed by your child's physician. All medications and inhalers stored in the office need to be clearly labeled with the child's name and any special instructions. Thank you for helping us to keep your child safe.

Under the current Board of Education Policy, staff members cannot dispense medication to students unless the Request for Assistance to Administer Medication form is fully completed and returned to the school and parents have contacted Mrs. Stride-Goudie (Principal) or Mrs. McIntyre (Assistant-Principal) to ensure the terms of division policy are met. Staff members are put at risk if the policy is not adhered to. A new form must be completed if the student changes schools, or when the student's condition or medication changes.

Peanut/Nut Allergies

MEDICAL DANGER - ANAPHYLAXIS

Some of our students have life-threatening allergies to nuts. The only way to ensure a safe environment for these children is to try and make our school NUT-AWARE. To do this we need everyone's co-operation. Please check the ingredients of all foods your children bring to school. Coconut is not a nut and does not pose any risk. In a classroom setting, cross-contamination is the greatest risk from this type of allergy. Cross-contamination is when a few crumbs from one child's snack are dropped and then picked-up by an allergic child. A small amount can kill. It is difficult at the best of times to get children to eat healthy snacks, however, we hope you will appreciate the seriousness of this condition and that you will assist us at the school in our efforts to create as safe an environment as possible. With your co-operation, we can minimize the risk of an allergic reaction. Anyone wishing further information about this type of allergy may contact the school library to sign out information videos on anaphylaxis. We appreciate families who assist us by not sending products to the school. We have a number of students with anaphylaxis at Brookwood School. Note: Our procedure is in accordance with Parkland School Division's Administrative Procedure AP 319 – Life Threatening Allergies, as well as, the Canadian School Boards Association's recommendations as outlined in "Anaphylaxis: A Handbook for School Boards".

We must try to contain the possibility of spreading protein residue throughout the school, as this presents a deadly risk to our students with Anaphylaxis. (Example: A student with peanut butter residue on hands may touch a ball, or a computer keyboard, and unknowingly spread the residue to a child with severe allergy).

Dogs/Pets on School Grounds

We ask that you please do not bring dogs or other pets onto the school grounds. There are a few of reasons for this:

1. We have students and staff who suffer from pet allergies (some severe) and wish to ensure that they are not put in dangerous or uncomfortable situations.

2. We have students who are afraid of animals, especially dogs, and this can raise the level of anxiety to uncomfortable levels in these students.

3. Given the large number of students at Brookwood (over 500 for 20/21) we also worry about pets being overwhelmed by the sheer number of children who may invade their space.

Thank you for your consideration of our request. Our goal is to ensure the well-being of everyone at Brookwood School.

Volunteer Program

We value the work that our volunteers do at Brookwood School. Annually, we logged approximately 3,500 volunteer hours! That is outstanding. Inclement Weather

IN & OUT Signs posted on doors

In the morning, Red, Grey, Grey Portable, Green & Yellow door teacher supervision begins at 8:15 am. Every morning, there will be a sign on each of the entrance doors indicating whether students will remain outside until the bell rings (a Red - OUT sign) or whether they will be coming inside due to inclement weather (a Green - IN sign). The school Administration will ultimately make the In/Out decision based on the conditions outdoors and adhering to the Administrative policy. If it is an indoor (In) morning, students will be asked to go to their designated/colored door where they will be allowed to enter and will be directed by teachers to enter their classrooms.

Should inclement weather prohibit playing outside for recess an announcement will be made declaring it an "inside day" and children will play in their classrooms. Recess decisions will be made by the school Administration and would likely happen only on very cold days, days with heavy rain, a significant blizzard or other reasons deemed necessary. Staff on supervision at that time will supervise the students in their classrooms. We ask that parents please honor the In/Out entrance signage and also please ensure that their children are **entering the school through their designated entrance doors**. All of this helps greatly with routines and traffic flow.

Brookwood's Early Education Classrooms

Early Education classrooms provide embedded programming for children with severe special needs four mornings or afternoons a week within play-based settings. Teams work collaboratively to meet the individual needs of each child within an inclusive environment.

Brookwood School's Maranatha Christian Program

"Following God's Direction" while supporting the traditional values of Home & Community

The Maranatha Christian Program (MCP) is available to all families who want their Kindergarten to Grade 4 children taught in a non-denominational, spiritually nurturing, intellectually challenging, and disciplined environment.

MCP supports the traditional values of the home by involving students in morning prayers, Bible reading, songs, and weekly assemblies with a Christian perspective. Sustained by Christ's teachings and God's love, students in the program are encouraged to develop binding commitments to their families, neighbors, country, and global community while leading moral, healthy, and productive lives. <u>Students</u>:

The Maranatha Christian Program is available to students who are Kindergarten to Grade 9. The Early Years Program is housed here at Brookwood School. The Middle Years Program, grades 5-9, is housed at Woodhaven Middle School.

Through the MCP Program, students will be encouraged to:

- Treat others with respect and focus on loving God and loving one another.
- Exhibit positive behavior and good work habits.
- Value the importance of community service.

<u>Parents:</u>

Parents with students enrolled in the MCP Program will:

- Demonstrate a commitment to the Christian Program and to the school.
- Create fellowship and work cooperatively with teachers to maintain a disciplined learning environment.
- Encourage their child/dren to display positive behaviors at all times.

<u>Teachers:</u>

Teachers chosen for the program are those who:

- Support the philosophy of the program.
- Articulate to students and parents the philosophy of Christian living.
- Apply Christian beliefs to instructional programming.
- Place the needs of their students in the center of all their efforts both in and outside the classroom.
- Discipline students within a Christian context, often involving prayer.
- Help students make links to Christ's teachings in situations where poor choices have been made.

• Encourage students to take pride in what they do and instill in them the belief that they have much to offer the world around them.
