In PSD, we help support families who need help getting their child(ren) to school. We know ther are many factors that affect attendance:

- Parents' work schedule

Often families don't realize how much school their child is missing and the impact that has on everyone. They are more behind than you think.





#### 19 or more days

Missing just **TWO** days every month can add up to **19** days in a school year. This is the equivalent of missing an ENTIRE MONTH of instructional days.



#### 10 to 18 days

Students who are absent an average of 15 days per year miss 1 YEAR'S WORTH of school by their graduating year.



#### 9 or fewer absences

Students with good attendance generally achieve higher grades and enjoy school more.

### **SCHOOL REMINDERS**

Some of our students and staff have life-threatening allergies to nuts and nut products.

Therefore, our school is "NUT-AWARE".

We are asking for your help and cooperation in ensuring our school continues to be safe by not sending any nut products to the school. Thank you in advance for your commitment to our safety!

### Pick-Up /Drop-Off Safety Reminder:

The bus lane in front of the school is reserved for buses and maintenance vehicles from 8:00 am until 4:00 pm daily. Please do not enter the bus lane during this time.

The main through lane in the parking lot is a <u>DROP and GO</u> lane. Parents are expected to remain in their vehicles. Your child will walk from your car to the school with the assistance of staff in safety vests. Vehicles in the bus lane and unattended cars in the drop-and-go block flow and create hazards to the safety of our students.

Please park in the guest parking area or the overflow lot if you wish to walk your child to their door or to the main entrance. Additionally, please note there are three reserved parking stalls in the staff lot. Please do not park in these stalls at any time throughout the day. Students will be dismissed from their homerooms and exit through their designated doors at 3:05 p.m.

- Parents/Guardians picking up students at school will be asked to wait outside the school.
- We would appreciate your assistance to ensure that all of our Brookwood students are safe and accounted for at the end of the school day. Here's how you can help:
  - Please ensure that your children meet you and stay with you at the end of the school day.
  - Please do not allow your children to play on the playground & swings prior to Bus Dismissal at 3:15.

#### **VOLUNTEERS AND VISITORS**

- We are happy to welcome volunteers at Brookwood School this year!
- For safety reasons, volunteers and visitors are required to check-in at the office.
   Our office staff are always happy to help you!

### **SCHOOL REMINDERS**

As much as we all enjoy pets, we ask that you keep your dog at home or away from the playground and general school population during school hours. For the safety of our students and your pet, distance is key.

Due to allergies and safety, pets cannot be brought inside Brookwood School, so we kindly ask that you please not bring your animals inside the school or on school property at any time. This includes both big and small dogs.

If you do walk your dog to school to meet your children after school, please kindly wait near the north fence by the bus loop entrance or on the east side of the fence near the alleyway. Thank you for your cooperation with this matter!

As the weather changes and winter gear is coming out please make sure you are clearly marking your child's gear with student names or initials as we have many identical jackets, footwear etc.

### Numeracy Corner

Did you know that playing card or board games can improve and strengthen your child's math skills while also creating valuable family bonding time?!

\*Each month here, we will share an easy math game for you and your child to play:

## Addition/Multiplication War

This card game for math is **played in pairs with one deck of cards per pair.** The rules are similar to that of the game of war, with a few differences. Split the deck of cards in half between the two players. **Students should not look at their cards.** At the same time, the players flip over TWO cards from the top of their pile. Students will then either **add or multiply** (whichever operation the teacher has specified) their two cards together. Whoever drew the **greater total** keeps all four cards.

If by chance, there is a tie, then the students will **leave the cards out** and go again. Whoever is the winner of that round, wins ALL 8 cards. The game is over when **one student has won all the cards.** 

For this game, **face cards are not necessary.** You can either take them out of the deck, or assign each one a number value (Jack = 11, Queen = 12, King = 13, Joker = 14) if desired.




## LITERACYCORNER

- 2. <u>Draw inferences</u>- "read between the lines".
- 3. <u>Self-monitor</u>-check for understanding, adjust their speed and ask questions.
- 4. <u>Form mental images</u>- form pictures in their head as they read.
- 5. <u>Summarize and retell</u>- ask your child to tell you a summary of what they have just read.
