



LEADERSHIP MESSAGE

Dear Brookwood Christian Families,

As we step into the month of October, we are reminded of the beauty of God's creation all around us. The warm colors of autumn leaves, the crisp air, and the change in seasons speak of God's faithfulness and order in our world. "While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, winter and summer, and day and night shall not cease" (Genesis 8:22, NKJV). Just as our wolf pup mascot learns to grow and adapt to each new season, our students too are learning to walk in God's love, grace, and wisdom as they grow in knowledge and faith.

One of the most beautiful ways our school community has been living out our faith is through our **Kindness Challenge.** As we collected food for the local food bank, we did so with thankful hearts, knowing that "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35, NKJV). Our original goal was to collect one pound of food for each of our students—515 pounds. Through the generosity of our families, we not only surpassed that goal but doubled it! Our theme this year is "Kindness Counts", and as we reflect on this, we are reminded of Ephesians 4:32 (NKJV): "And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you." Our Kindness Counts wall is beginning to fill with the many ways students are showing Christlike love to one another through everyday acts of compassion. As we approach Thanksgiving on October 13th, it is also a wonderful time to pause and remember to be thankful. "In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thessalonians 5:18, NKJV). Gratitude shapes our hearts to see God's goodness in every season.


